Dr. N.E. Webb Dies While He Is Attending Patient

Physician Was Native of Maryland and Began Residence in This City 28 Years Ago

Dr. Newton E. Webb, for many years a practicing physician in Southeast Washington, died suddenly this morning while attending a patient at 1350 Massachusetts avenue southeast. He had been suffering for some time with heart trouble.

Dr. Webb was born fifty-six years ago in New London, Md. He came to Washington about twenty-eight years ago, completing his education and graduating in medicine from the National University here. He began the practice of his profession shortly after graduation and had attained a large clientele of local residents.

He was a member of the Washington Board of Trade and the Medical Society of the District of Columbia and was a director of the People's Commercial and Savings Bank. He was a communicant in the Epworth Methodist Episcopal Church South.

Dr. Webb is survived by his wife, Mrs. Nannie L. Webb; by a sister, Mrs. Aggie Shultz, and by a brother, Lucien Webb, the last two named residing in Frederick, Md.

Funeral arrangements had not been completed today, but it is understood that the services will be held Monday afternoon at the residence, 1314 East Capitol street. Interment probably will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Southeast Physician Dies While Attending a Patient

Dr. Newton E. Webb, who has practiced for many years in southeast Washington, died yesterday while attending a patient. He had been suffering from heart trouble. Funeral services will probably be held this afternoon at his residence, 1314 East Capitol street, and interment will be in Congressional cemetery.

Dr. Webb came to Washington from New London, Md., 28 years ago, graduating in medicine from the National university here. He was 56 years old. Dr. Webb was a member of the Board of Trade and the Medical society and a director of the Peoples Commercial and Savings Bank. He was also a member of the Epworth Methodist Episcopal Church South. Surviving are his wife, a sister, Mrs. Aggie Shultz, and a brother, Lucien Webb, who lives in Frederick, Md.
