A Policeman Shot At

About nine o'clock on Saturday morning, while Policeman W.C. Weeden was walking along Maryland avenue, in the vicinity of 8th street, one of a party of soldiers, who were some distance from him drew his revolver and fired. The ball struck a book in the left hand side pocket of the policeman and glanced off, thus preventing a dangerous if not fatal wound. Mr. Weeden then asked the officer in charge of the squad to deliver up the man who fired the shot to which he replied that he (Weeden) could have him if he would point out the offender, and marched the soldiers off.
