Saleswoman Patricia A. Weiss, 44, a former congressional aide who was an interior design saleswoman with Ademas Tile Co. from 1984 to 1991, died of cirrhosis July 18 at Fairfax Hospital. A resident of the Washington area for 24 years, she lived in Annandale.

Mrs. Weiss was a native of Alma, Ga. She worked on Capitol Hill initially as an assistant editor of the daily digest of the Senate. She later was an aide to Sen. David Gambrell (D-Ga.) and Rep. Byron Dorgan (D-N.D.). She also was a legislative aide with the White and Case law firm.

Mrs. Weiss was a member of St. Peter's Catholic Church in Washington.

Her marriages to Edward Springer and Paul Weiss ended in divorce.

Survivors include two children from her second marriage, Mark and Clare Weiss, both of Washington; two brothers, Charles Wolfe of Auburn, Ala., and Robert Wolfe of Charlotte, N.C.; and a sister, Shirley Wolfe of Salt Lake City.
