Frank 'Pop' White Dies In Hospital

Oldest Mason in Oldest U.S. Masonic Lodge Succumbs to Pneumonia

Frank H. "Pop" White, oldest member of the oldest Masonic Lodge in the United States, died in Sibley Hospital yesterday after a short illness. Death was due to bronchial pneumonia.

Mr. White, who was 77 years old had been a member of Norfolk, Va., Lodge. No. 1, F.A.A.M., for the past 56 years.

In recent years the members of the Norfolk Lodge have joined with his fellow Masons of National Lodge No. 12, of this city, to which he also belonged, and his other Masonic friends in celebrating the anniversary of his admission into Masonry. These celebrations alternated in Norfolk and this city.

Six years ago on the occasion of the celebration of his fiftieth anniversary as a Mason, White presented the Norfolk Lodge with a Bible which had been in his family for many generations. Since then the Bible has been used at the initiation ceremonies held by the lodge.

Mr. White also was a member of the Kallipolis Grotto and the Gavel Club here.

A native of Norfolk, Mr. White at an early age became connected with the show business as stage carpenter and followed this work until a short time ago, working her at the Belasco and National Theaters. During his long career he had become acquainted with many of the stage celebrities. He came to this city about 1902.

Mr. White is survived by his widow, Mrs. Nellie C. White, who before her marriage was Miss Beckett; two sons, Charles J. White of this city and Frank E. White of Lanham, Md., and by eight grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted at Zurhorst's funeral parlors, 301 East Capitol street, Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Interment will be in Congressional Cemetery.
