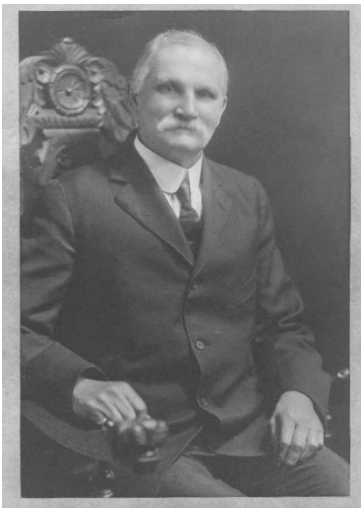

### **Frederick W. Whyte Dies In Heart Attack Found Unconscious on Street -- Was Lifelong Resident of City and Railway Employe**

Frederick William Whyte, 80 years old, 825 Fourth street northeast, was found unconscious near Fourth and H streets northeast about 10:15 o'clock this morning. He was taken to the home of neighbors and a physician summoned from Casualty Hospital. Death occurred before the physician reached the house and was due to heart trouble.

Mr. Whyte, a lifelong resident of Washington, was born here on February 11, 1847, the son of Capt. Fred Whyte, U.S.A. In 1871 he married Lula Newton, who died in 1874, and three years later he married Elizabeth Taylor, who survives him.

Besides his widow, F. Whyte is survived by two sons, Joseph C., foreman of the composing room of The Star, and Noble F. Whyte; a daughter Miss Minnie Whyte; two grandsons, Clifton A. and Ellwood Whyte, and a great-grandson, Clifton A. Whyte, jr.

For more than 50 years, until his retirement a few years ago, Mr. Whyte was connected with the Southern Railway, being awarded the bronze service medal of honor in token of the completion of half a century of constant service. He was affiliated with Calanthe Lodge, Knights of Pythias.
