Choked to Death

We learn that a child of Mr. Widdecomb, a clerk in the office of the Auditor of the Post Office Department, who resides on the corner of Tenth and F streets, was choked to death this morning by a piece of meat getting into the windpipe. Dr. Holston was called to his assistance, but arrived too late to prevent fatal consequences, although he made an incision into the windpipe. The obstruction had passed the point where the incision was made, and too far to be reached by instruments.
