Leonard Williams Dies In Clarendon

Member of Advertising Firm Here Was Widely Known in Business Circles

George Leonard Williams, 42 years old, partner in the Kal-Williams Advertising Agency, former member of The Star Advertising Bureau and widely known in local business circles, died at his residence, 125 Beach street, Clarendon Va., last night. He had been in failing health for the past six months.

Born in Prince Georges County, Md., Mr. Williams came to Washington with his parents, the late George Francis and Irene Roberta Williams. He was educated in the local public schools and received early training as an advertising solicitor, in which capacity he entered the employment of The Star about 19 years ago.

He afterward became one of the widely known members of The Star Advertising Bureau, with which he remained until about two years ago, when he became associated with Norman C. Kal, president of the Washington Advertising Club, in the Kal-Williams Advertising Agency.

Mr. Williams was a member of the Stansbury Lodge of Masons and the Washington Advertising Club.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Grace May Williams; his daughter, Miss Gwendolyn Williams; a son, Gordon Williams; three brothers, James A., Bernard M. and William E. Williams, and a sister, Mrs. E.C. Mattingly.
