J.A. Williams Dies

Benning Power Plant Engineer Had Been Ill Ten Days

James Alexander Williams, 54, an engineer at the Benning plant of the Potomac Electric Power Co., died last night after an illness of 10 days. Funeral services will be held at the home, 1505 E street southeast, by Rev. Edward Gabler of Christ Church, at 2:30 tomorrow afternoon. Burial will be in Congressional Cemetery.

Mr. Williams was born in Prince Georges, Md., and came to Washington with his parents as a boy. He has lived here since.

He is survived by his widow Mrs. May Juliette Williams; two daughters, Miss Florence Williams and Mrs. Doris Armentrout, both of this city; a sister, Mrs. Elmer C. Mattingly, and two brothers, Bernard McKee Williams of Washington and William E. Williams, Clarendon, Va.
