Irving Williamson, Lawyer, Dies At 70

Veteran of the Bar Was Born Near Annapolis and Lived in Capital Since Boyhood

Irving Williamson, a lawyer of this city for the past forty-nine years died last night at his home, 1710 R street northwest, following an illness of three weeks. He had been actively engaged in the practice of law up to the time of his last illness. He was seventy years old. The funeral will be held from the family home Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock. The interment will be in Congressional cemetery. The pallbearers, the list of which has not been completed, will be made up of members of the bench and bar, personal friends from the professional and business life of the city.

Mr. Williamson was born near Annapolis, Md, in 1853. He came to Washington with his parents when a small boy and has resided here since. He was educated in the schools of Washington and completed his education at old Columbian University, now George Washington University, and graduated in the law class of that institution in 1874 and immediately thereafter established himself in the general practice of law in Washington, which he has prosecuted since. He was a member of the Rod and Gun Club of Harpers Ferry, W. Va., was one of the District of Columbia bar examiners and a communicant of the Washington Heights Presbyterian Church. He was not affiliated with any of the fraternal organizations. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Sarah P. Williamson, and a daughter, Miss Eleanor Williamson, of this city.
