Accidental Drowning

On Friday evening last, the 15th instant, a small boy, son of Mr. David Wilson, of Greenleaf's Point, accidentally fell from the Fish wharf, foot of Sixth street, and was drowned. Up to this time (Sunday) his body has not been recovered. We are requested to say that it is hoped by his bereaved parents that if anyone finds it they will either return it to his father's residence, on Greenleaf's Point, or give information where it may be obtained.

We learn that on Saturday last the body of Henry Wilson, who fell into the Potomac from the fish wharf in this city on the 15th instant, was found on the shore of Dr. Daingerfield's farm, near Alexandria. The corpse has been restored to the poor boy's afflicted parents residing at Greenleaf's Point.
