79, the resident manager of the Chase Plaza apartments on Connecticut Avenue NW in Washington from 1970 until she retired last year, died of a heart ailment April 16 at Georgetown University Hospital.

Miss Wood, who lived in Washington, was born in New Bedford, Mass. She moved to Washington in the early 1930s and went to work for Raymond C. Alvis, a promoter of sporting events, barn dances, ice review and other events. She was his assistant until the early 1940s.

She then was a cashier at Milstone Liquors and Caruso's restaurant until about 1968, when she became resident manager of an apartment building at 14th and Aspen streets NW. She then went to the Chase Plaza apartments.

Miss Wood was a member of the American Legion Auxiliary.

She leaves no immediate survivors.
