Fatally Hurt By Train

L.E. Woods Dies Three Hours After Accident on Railroad

L.E. Woods, forty-three years old, 801 A street southeast, who was employed in the navy yard as a machinist, was struck by a northbound railroad train near University station last night and so seriously injured that he died at Casualty Hospital three hours later.

The police investigated the affair and reported that Woods attempted to board a moving train and was knocked down. His left leg was fractured in several places and he was otherwise injured about the head and body.

Coroner Nevitt visited the scene of the accident this morning and found that Woods probably was more than seventy-five feet north of the station when the train struck him. An inquest will be held Monday morning to determine the question of responsibility for the accident. Woods was unmarried.
