Retires After 26 Years

After sixty-five years of service for the government, Henry J. Wylie of Pittsfield, Mass., an employe of the quartermaster's department of the Marine Corps, in this city, is to be honorably retired on a pension at the age of eighty-two years.

Mr. Wylie entered the postal service in 1855 at the age of seventeen, and next served in the civil war in the 49th Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry. On being mustered out in August, 1863, he was appointed a clerk in the ordnance department, at the Washington navy yard.

In 1875 he was transferred to the Marine Corps, in which he is now rounding out his forty-fifth year of continuous service.

H.V. Wylie Succumbs

Government Employe for More Than Half a Century

Henry V. Wylie, civil war veteran and government employe for more than half a century, died yesterday at his residence, 317 A street southeast. He was eighty-three years old.

Mr. Wylie was born at Pittsfield, Mass., September 27, 1838. He served in the 49th Massachusetts Infantry during the civil war. At the close of the war he came to Washington where he later became attached to the ordnance department of the navy yard. He later left there to enter the quartermaster's department as a clerk. He was retired August 20, 1920. He was a member of Lebanon Lodge, A.F. and A.M.; Knights Templar, Columbia Temple, and senior warden in St. Mark's Episcopal Church.

Surviving him is a daughter, Mrs. May E. Jeffords. Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock at St. Mark's Church, 3d and A streets southeast. Interment will be in Congressional cemetery.
