### **Succumbs to Injuries**

#### **Fall From Ladder in National Museum Fatal to G.W. Yeatman**

George W. Yeatman, who accidentally fell from a ladder yesterday morning while at work in the National Museum building, died at the Emergency Hospital yesterday afternoon, as the result of an unavoidable accident, Coroner Nevitt decided.

Mr. Yeatman was a native of this city and was one of the best known residents of South Washington. He was a member of Lafayette Lodge, Knights Templar, a member of the Golden Cross and Amity Lodge, No. 27, Independent Order of Odd Fellows. He is survived by a wife and three children-- Millard S. and George M. Yeatman and Mrs. Fanny L. Rabbitt. Harry F. Rabbitt, son-in-law of the deceased, was working near the scene of the accident yesterday when Mr. Yeatman fell. Funeral services for Mr. Yeatman will probably be held Monday at his late home, 490 Maryland avenue southwest.
