<p>[Correspondence of the Baltimore Sun ] WASHINGTON, July 27, 1848. <b>UNITED STATES CRIMINAL COURT.</b> <b>The Slave Stealing Cases.</b> These cases were commenced this morning by the arraignment of Daniel Drayton (the supercargo of the schooner) upon the following indictments: <i>District of Columbia, Washington county, to wit:</i> The jurors of the United States, for the county aforesaid, upon their oath, present, That Daniel Drayton, late of the county aforesaid, laborer, on the fifteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, with force and arms, in the county aforesaid, two slaves of the value of one thousand dollars, of the goods and chattels of one Andrew Hoover, then and there being, feloniously did steal, take, and carry away, against the form of the statute in such cases made and provided, and against the peace and Government of the United States.
